REPORT ON PARKS AND RECREATION ACTIVITIES

Mrs. Hutchinson announced that Monday Madness will begin on June 9th at 2:00pm in the Municipal Ballroom. Monday Madness is a free program that provides an educational and fun performance. The first performer will be the Dallas Puppet Theater. Each performance usually has between 300-500 people and concessions will be available for purchase. The Splash opened Memorial weekend and Learn to Swim will begin on Monday, June 9th. The senior class picnic will be held at the Splash on Friday, June 6th. The family campout is scheduled for June 13th at Fairview Park. Shakespeare in the Grove is at Pecan Grove Park West next weekend and is a free event.

REPORT ON PARKS AND RECREATION SPORTS

Mr. Hubert announced that SYSA baseball has finished and the SYSA softball has about two weeks left. Sherman hosted a high school playoff game between Van Alstyne and Pottsboro. Mr. Hubert reported that the Spring softball league has ended and the Summer league will begin the first Thursday of June. The logo for the softball state tournament has been finalized. The tournament is the week of July 13th at Old Settler's Park and can have up to 23 teams playing. Opening day will be on Sunday and a Movie in the Park is scheduled for that Tuesday. SYSA will be taking care of concessions and Member John Murphy wanted to know what the board members could do to help with the tournament. Mr. Hubert said he would get back with the board members on what kind of help would be needed. Pickleball will begin on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from June 10 – August 24 at 9:00am at the

Taylor St. complex.

REPORT ON PARKS MAINTENANCE

Mr. Mrozinski reported that with soccer and baseball season finished his department has started their summer schedule of park maintenance. They are in the process of watering which includes the 200 trees that were donated. The maintenance department will begin working on Pecan Grove Park West for Lights on the Lake and Old Settler's Park for a youth baseball tournament. Ten seasonal employees have been hired and out of those ten employees two will be fired for full time positions. Mr. Mrozinski said he was looking to hire two more seasonal employees and a gardener. The department has two Eagle Scout Projects going on.

REPORT ON SENIOR CENTER

Mrs. Howard announced that Mrs. Stephenson is now the Senior Citizens Center Assistant. Together they have made some changes to the newsletter. Mrs. Howard announced some of the upcoming activities which include a dance with a band, donation sale, a recipe club, and a Father's Day Pool tournament.

Member Lauren Roth passed out flyers for Hot Summer Nights. Member Tracey Brown wanted to know when the advertising for Lights on the Lake would begin and Mrs. Hutchinson said that tourism would handle all of the advertising for that event.
