Mayor Bill Magers called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.
The Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation were given by

Mayor Magers explained that he was wearing a Denison Yellow Jacket Football Jersey because he and Denison Mayor Robert Brady bet on the recent Sherman-Denison Football Game. Sherman lost the game by a score of 44 to 43.

Michael A. Womack, 2601 Cornerstone Drive

Mr. Womack, CEO of Texoma Medical Center Behavioral Health Center in Sherman, felt that if Texas required a "Certificate of Need" process, there would be no question as to whether or not another geriatric psyche facility was needed in Sherman.

He said the new facility is being presented as meeting an underserved population or area, or a need that isn't already being met. TMC has had a geriatric psyche unit for 15 years, and currently has a 75% occupancy rate out of the 28 beds. The area also has skilled nursing homes and skilled nursing facilities.

Mr. Womack did not feel that there was a need for an additional geriatric psyche unit in the area. Mayor Magers verified that the TMC Behavioral Health Center would be a competitor of the new facility if it is allowed to open. Mr. Womack reiterated that he was addressing a need in the community.

Sherry Bustin, 2905 Houston Street, Kilgore, Texas

Ms. Bustin, Regional Administrator of Allegiance Health Management and Operations for their Inpatient and Outpatient Psychiatric Services in Texas, said they are a regional provider of geriatric psyche services. She added that one out of four senior adults suffers from mental illness, and 80% of those never get help.

Mayor Magers confirmed that they are a for-profit business.

No other citizens appeared before the City Council to discuss Ordinance 5494.

Mayor Magers introduced Ordinance 5498 and called for a public hearing:

Deputy Mayor Adami said he has received calls from concerned citizens and he asked to clarify the long-term intention of the company. Originally the project was presented as both an adult and geriatric psyche facility, with additional services. Now the company is asking to operate a geriatric psyche facility only. He asked if that was a long-term goal of the company.

Ms. Bustin said Allegiance Health Management specializes in geriatric programs and that is their long-term goal. They were entertaining the option that if their company branched out into adult services, to have the option to do that at a later date. Their long-term goal is not as an adult facility. They intend for the facility to be a fully-functioning geriatric psyche facility for people age 55 and over, both inpatient and outpatient.

Council Member Terrence Steele asked what was considered regional for attracting patients. Ms. Bustin said they expect to attract patients from about 75 miles around Sherman. They will be accepting referrals from nearby cities.

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John Boswell, President of the Sherman Economic Development Corporation, said the Board has not studied the issue, but across the State, the economic development profession has a consensus.

They feel that the bill introduced is not clear as to what would be taxed and has created a lot of controversy. The position of the Texas Economic Development Council is to continue to tax those items that are taxed today.

The bill would open up almost all inventory to be exempt from taxation if it moves from your building to a building you don't control, within 175 days. The Council feels the statute will be changed at the next opportunity, and many cities have already adopted the position to continue to tax these goods.

Mr. Boswell said the tax will not put Sherman in an uncompetitive position because other Texas cities are doing the same thing. If a disadvantage is realized later, the City can then adopt the exemption.

Council Member Terrence Steele verified that other cities are continuing to tax. Mr. Boswell said he has made the same recommendation to Grayson County and Grayson County College.

Ben Uselton, Parks and Recreation Administrator, updated the City Council on the purchase of playground equipment for Hawn Park which was approved as a Capital Improvement Program project for FY 2007-2008.

Mr. Uselton explained items what will be included in the project adding that some of the existing equipment will be utilized. He presented a drawing of the proposed project.

Mr. Uselton said fencing will also be done which is not included in the current proposal. City maintenance crews will be used to remove some of the existing borders to reduce costs.

If the items are ordered prior to November 30, 2007, Mr. Uselton said the City will receive a 10% discount.

Mr. Uselton said the skate ground was originally opened in February 2000 and the obstacles have been rebuilt one or two times each. A new product has been found that is made of concrete and includes a 15 year warranty. Mr. Uselton said the new equipment is a little more expensive but should save a lot of man-hours on future rebuilding and should be safer for skaters. It will also be easier to maintain.

The proposed project will include three new skate pieces this year and Mr. Uselton said he will request three to four new pieces next year so the replacement project can be completed.

Council Member Smith confirmed the heavy usage that Hawn Park receives with the splash ground and the skate ground.

Deputy Mayor Adami asked to remove Item C-3 from the Consent Agenda for discussion during its regular order of business.

Deputy Mayor Adami said the City used to have a policy where vehicles were “turned over” every few years. He wanted to be sure there was a policy because the City had purchased several fire vehicles recently. He wanted to adequately space the purchase of these vehicles so there would be a cycle for the replacement.

George Olson, City Manager, said the City does have a policy on vehicle replacement in place, and the staff is currently considering the expansion of the policy to include all City vehicles to assure they are replaced as needed.

The current rescue vehicle was an old ambulance that was converted into a rescue vehicle and it is used approximately four or five times daily.

Deputy Mayor Adami confirmed that the new vehicle is expected to last seven years. Jeff Jones, Fire Chief, added that historically, the City replaces one ambulance per year which gives a rotation of about six years. Deputy Mayor Adami asked if the City is still replacing boxes and drive

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trains separately. Chief Jones said the newer ambulances have the ability to remount the box one time. This ambulance was retained for use as a rescue vehicle three years ago, rather than sending it to auction.

Council Member Wacker said it would apply only to their teams. Mr. Olson said TSA does fine people for their policy, but the City does not fine them. Council Member Smith urged any citizen that is fined by TSA for using a City field, not to pay the fine.
