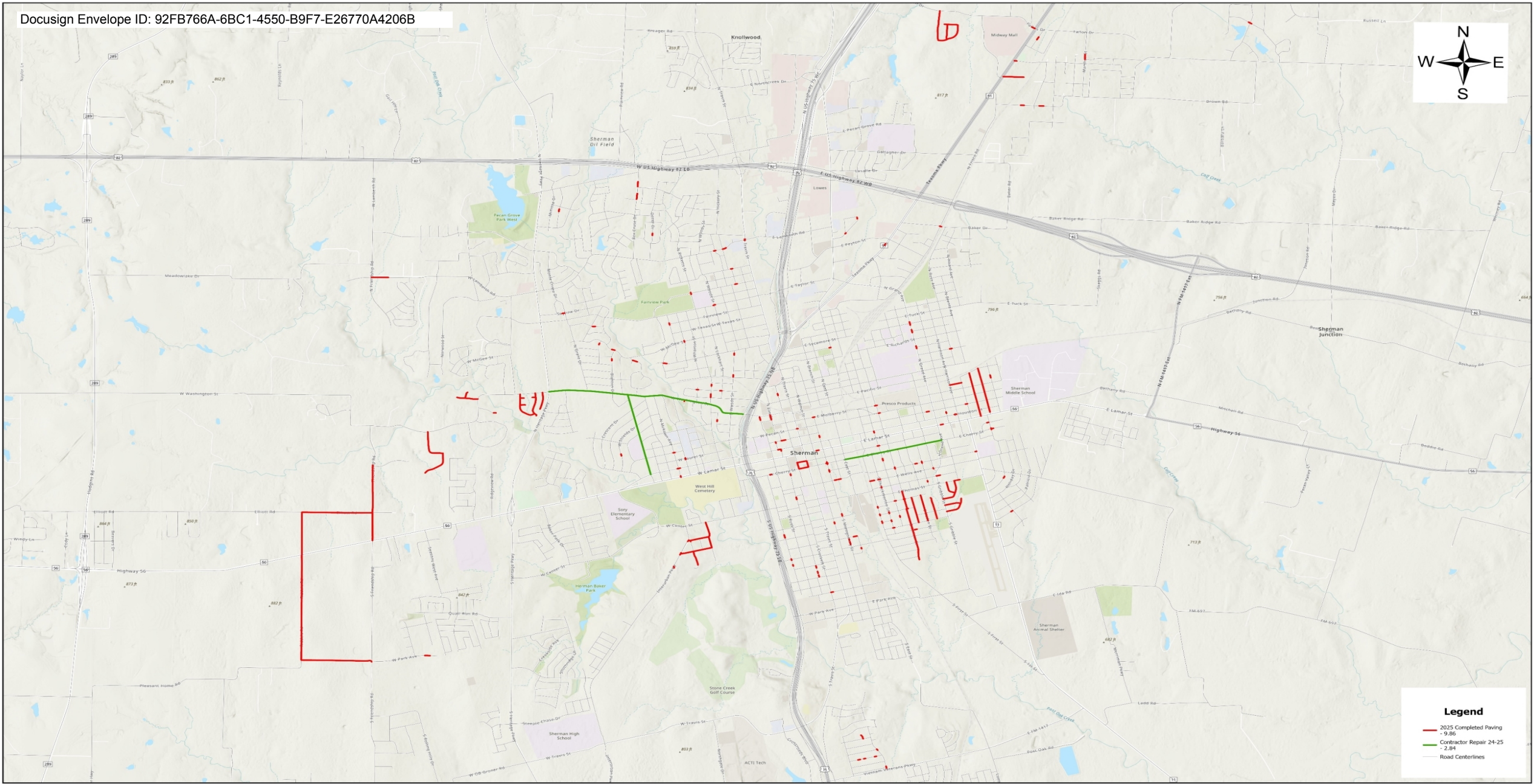

# Sherman Paving Plan to date

Since January 2025 crews have continued conducting work in all quadrants of the city.

City crews have paved approximately 10 miles of roadway which includes focusing on neighborhoods to establish a regular maintenance routine.

Contractor support has been a great assistance completing approximately 3 miles of paving. These projects are usually more comprehensive which includes removing old cement roadways that were chipseal over as well as curb/gutter work. Sidewalks are addressed when appropriate and funding allows. Projects include Sunset Blvd, Washington St, and Cherry St projects.

- Road Centerlines

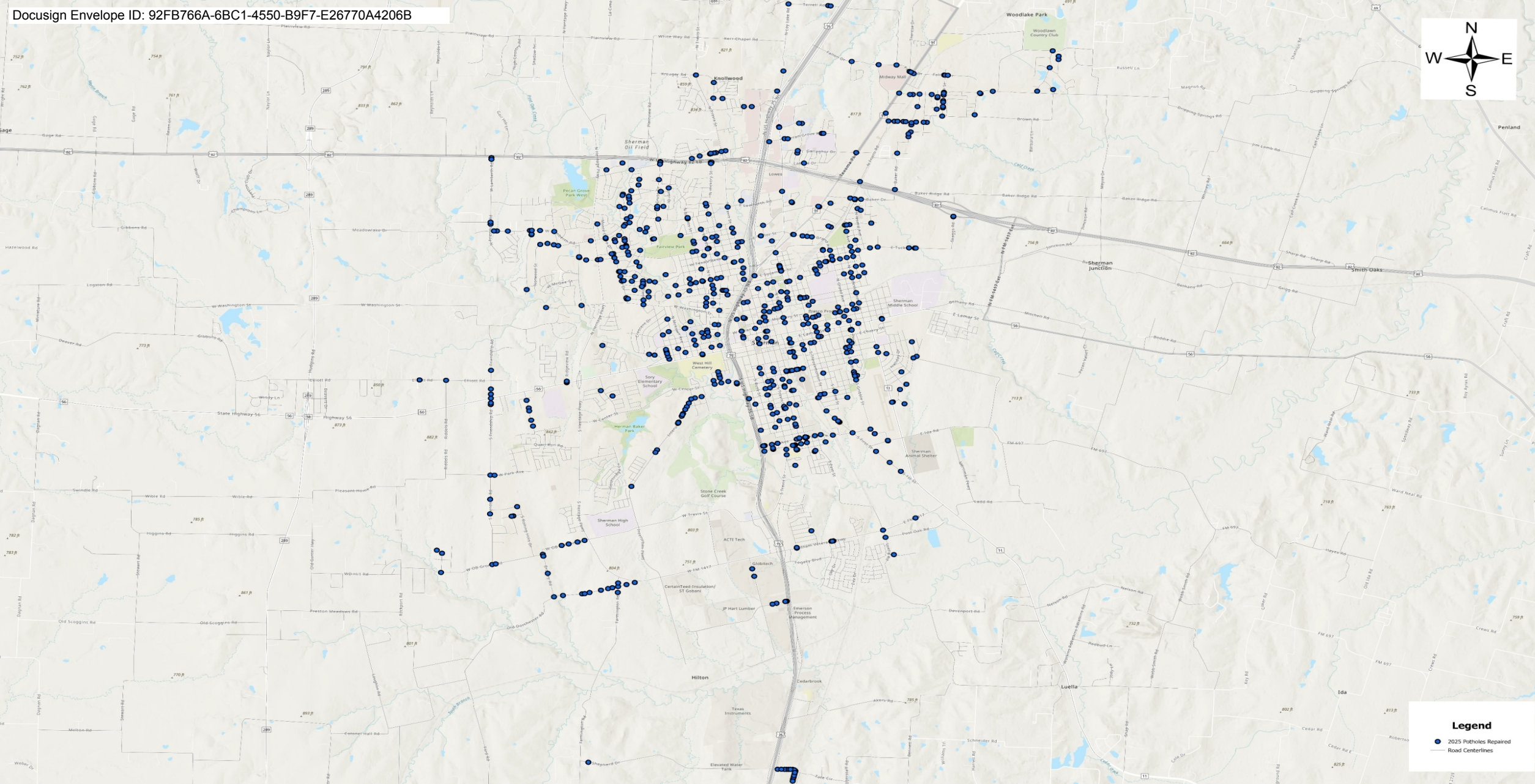

# Concrete repairs to date

Concrete crews are responsible for curb and gutter repair/replacement, concrete roadway repairs, utility cuts and panel replacements.



These crews work in advance of the asphalt crew to repair/replace damaged curb and gutters to keep asphalt paving operations on schedule.

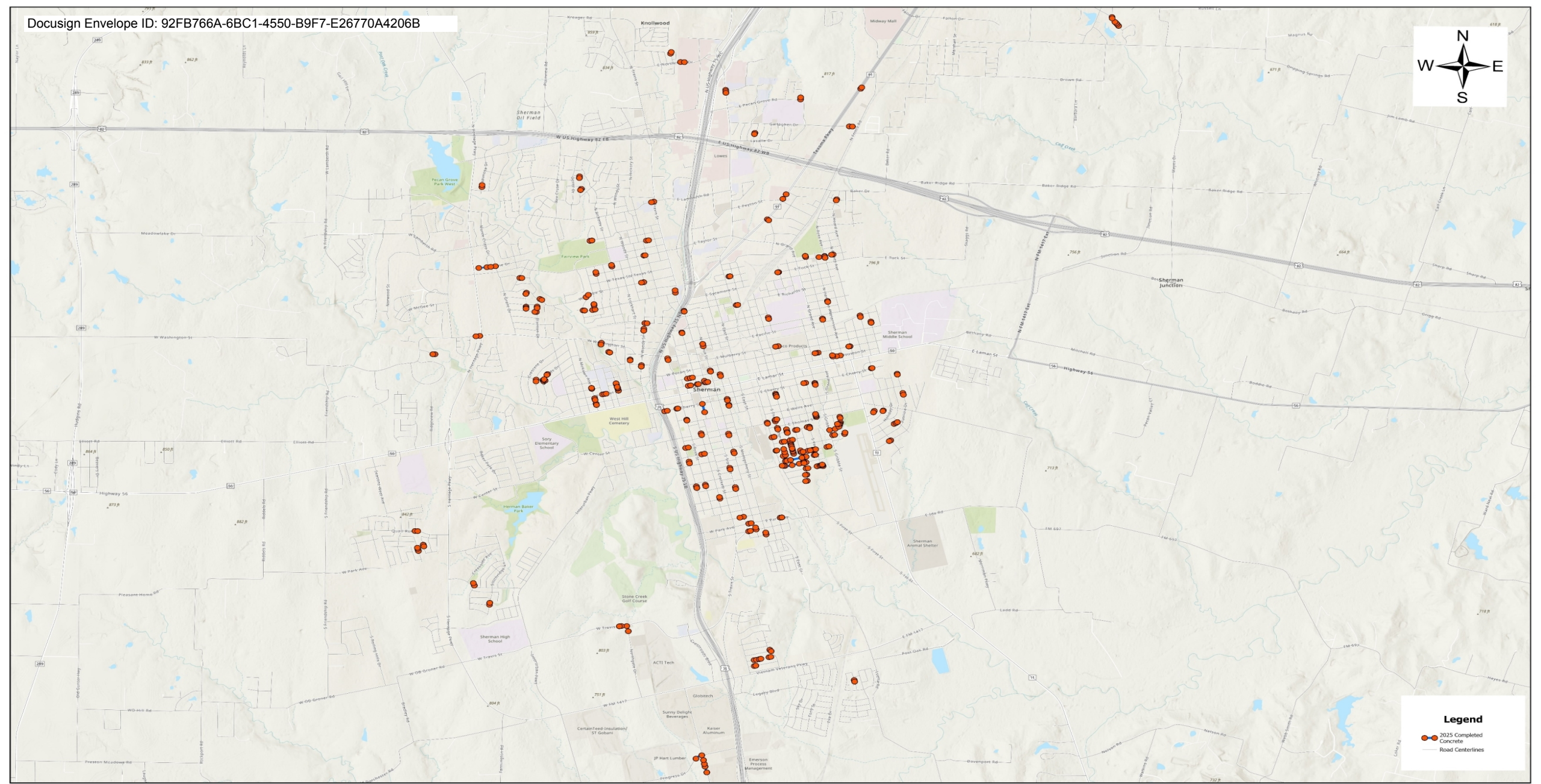


This crew has also worked in all four quadrants of the city and is responsible for approximately 375 cubic yards of concrete work.

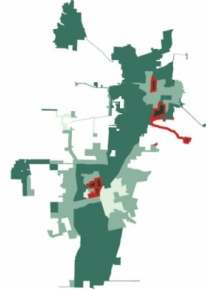

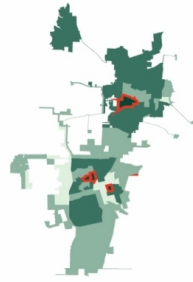

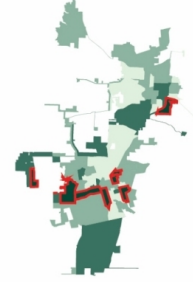

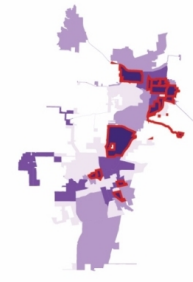

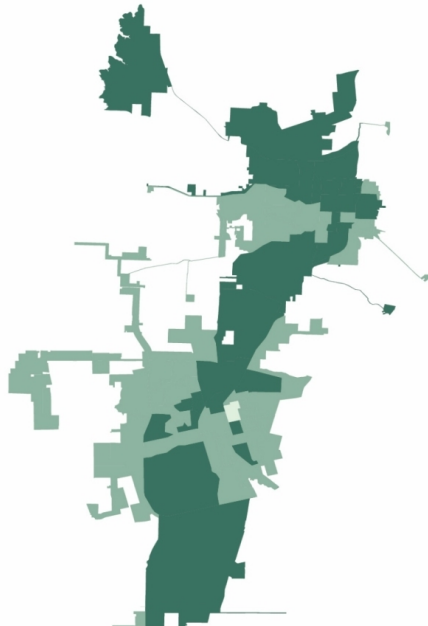
College Population



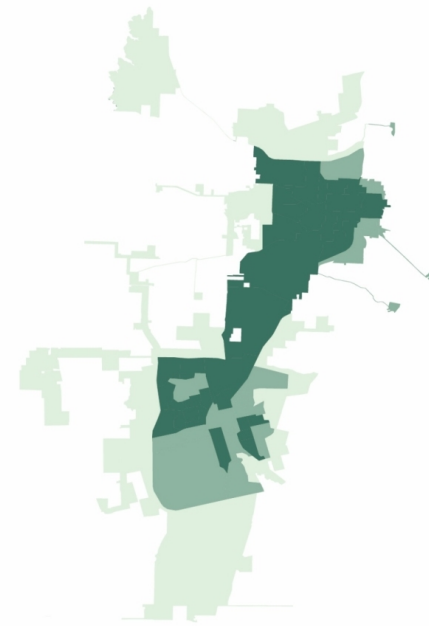
Low-Income Population



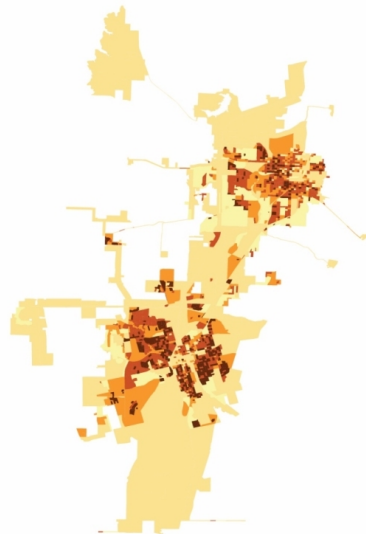
Transit Needs Index by Percentage
